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A MILLENNIAL MOM'S JOURNEY TO FINDING THE PERFECT SCHOOL IN CLEVELAND

Pierra and Pace Heard

Cleveland native Pierra Heard, a Case Western Reserve University professional and the force behind the thriving online community Millennial Mommying, recently opened up about her family's journey to find the perfect school for her gifted daughter, Pace. After relocating from Tampa back to her hometown, Pierra faced the daunting task of navigating the Cleveland public school landscape. With Pace's preschool years approaching, Pierra knew she needed a supportive environment that would cater to her daughter's unique needs.

When Pace was about to turn 3 years old, her home care provider suggested that Pierra get her daughter tested for giftedness.

"The Florida school system wasn't the right environment for her," Pierra shares, "and I also didn't have the capacity to homeschool." With her daughter being so young, she felt that going straight into an elementary school classroom environment might be too much for Pace. The decision to return to Cleveland was fueled in part by the presence of a strong network to guide her through the school choice process.

Friend and fellow Millennial Mommy Khadijah Fair introduced Pierra to the Cleveland Transformation Alliance (CTA), where Khadijah served as the family engagement manager. Khadijah introduced Pierra to the idea of Early Kindergarten programs and invited her to a kindergarten readiness fair at the Children's Museum of Cleveland. After learning about CTA's tools for researching area schools, Pierra attended an open house at East Academy, a public charter school on Kipling Avenue in Cleveland with an Early Kindergarten program.

"I really hit it off with the staff, and that ultimately drove my decision," Pierra recalls. "The staff really cared. They listened. They had conversations with me and with Pace as if she were already a student there." The school's commitment to transparency and individualized attention resonated deeply with Pierra. Pace, too, was embraced by the East Academy community. Several visits before her first day, including a meet-the-teacher day, ensured a smooth transition.

This sense of familiarity and belonging made Pace's transition to Early Kindergarten seamless and exciting.

"The Cleveland Transformation Alliance was a big help in figuring out our options," Pierra says, "especially with having a child that came from a different background. She didn't have any experience with a school environment, but she was learning at home. She had never been in daycare because the pandemic hit."

The Cleveland Transformation Alliance provided Pierra with resources like the School Quality Guide and informational fairs, which introduced her to different types of schools, learning models, and educational programs.

Khadijah provided personalized assistance by helping Pierra find a suitable school and enroll her daughter.

For Pierra and Pace, the CTA was more than just a resource: It was a partner in their educational journey. Pierra's journey underscores the invaluable role the Cleveland Transformation Alliance plays in empowering parents to become advocates for their children's education.

Today, Pace is flourishing at East Academy and will soon turn 6, her academic and social needs met with understanding and flexibility. "They're able to accommodate her," Pierra beams. "She's already reading at a first-grade level, so they're working with her to spend time in the first-grade classroom."

"I felt really good about the choice," Pierra reflects. She says the most important things to keep in mind when choosing a school for your child are being open-minded, transparent about your needs, and trusting your instincts while letting your child lead. She also emphasizes the importance of being realistic about your own needs, such as before- or after-school care or transportation, and prioritize those schools who can meet your needs.

"The Cleveland Transformation Alliance is a great resource for families who are feeling overwhelmed by the school choice process," Pierra says. "They can help you find the right school for your child, no matter what your needs or circumstances may be."

Earlier this year, Pierra learned that Pace would be able to attend Campus International School, which is part of CMSD, after a space had opened in her grade. After winter break, Pace started at her new school, and has been adapting well to her new school home.

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TIMELINE

FALL 2011

Cleveland Mayor Frank G. Jackson convenes a coalition of education, nonprofit, philanthropic, and business leaders to forge a dramatically different path for Cleveland schools.

SPRING 2012

The coalition sends Cleveland's Plan for Transforming Schools to Ohio's governor and lawmakers.

JULY 2012

State legislators pass the bipartisan House Bill 525 to implement the Cleveland Plan. Governor Kasich signs the bill into law, enabling reform work to begin.



NOVEMBER 2012

Voters approve a 15-mill school levy, the first operating levy passed in 16 years and the largest in the city's history. For the first time, a share of operating levy money is set aside for high-performing charter schools formally partnered with or sponsored by the CMSD.



DECEMBER 2012

The Cleveland Transformation Alliance, a new nonprofit tasked with overseeing reform efforts, begins operations.



MAY 2013

The Cleveland Teachers Union votes on a new contract that formalizes changes in state law and provides additional flexibility at the school level. Key elements include changing the teacher compensation system, reducing the weight of seniority in layoff decisions, and providing schools with more say in hiring, and the length of the school day.



SPRING 2014

The Alliance launches its website and releases its comprehensive guide on school quality for all Cleveland public schools, both district and charter.



Pre4CLE launches with a goal of ensuring all 3- and 4-year-old children in Cleveland have access to a high-quality preschool by: Increasing the number of high-quality preschools in Cleveland; Helping preschool providers improve their quality rating; Connecting families to quality preschool programs.

AUGUST 2014

CMSD begins to leverage its new structure, work rules, and other systemic changes made possible by the Cleveland Plan.

NOVEMBER 2014

Voters pass a capital bond to support the CMSD's Facilities Master Plan.



JUNE 2015

The Alliance releases its first report to the community on the implementation and impact of the Cleveland Plan.

FALL 2015

Building on the Higher Education Compact's efforts to improve college readiness, access, and persistence rates for CMSD students, the local community begins to explore Say Yes to Education as a potential partner in reform efforts.

The Ohio legislature overwhelmingly passed House Bill 2, which significantly strengthens the accountability structures that govern Ohio's charter sector without compromising the school level autonomy that is critical to the charter school model.

FALL 2016

Voters approve Issue 108, a renewal of the 15-mill operating levy first passed in 2012.

JANUARY 2019

Cleveland officially becomes the fourth Say Yes to Education chapter in the nation, announcing nearly \$82 million in gifts raised out of a total campaign of \$125 million, which will fund post-secondary scholarships for Cleveland residents who graduate from CMSD or partnering charter high schools for the next 25 years.

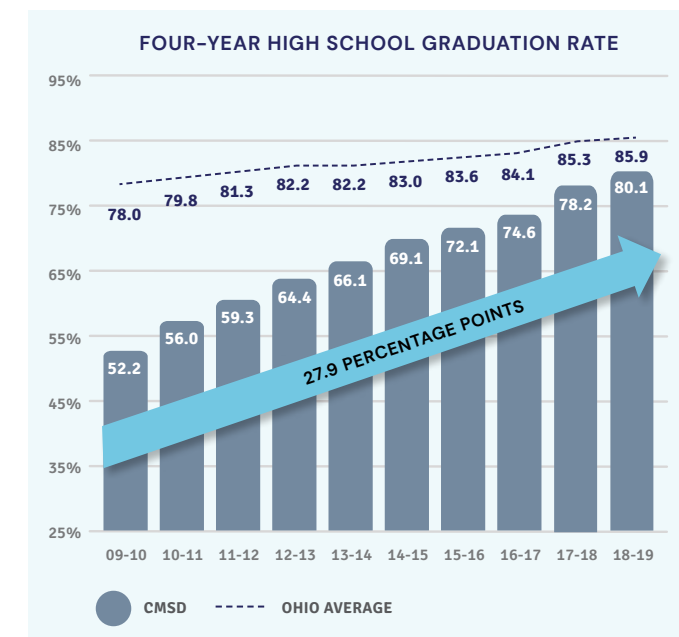


SPRING 2019

CMSD, at the urging of the Bond Accountability Commission, begins a review of its Master Facilities Plan with long-term planning meetings for its K-8 schools. Factors considered include building age and use, program strength, and population trends across the city. Charter schools are part of that review.

FALL 2020

The Ohio Department of Education releases data on CMSD's graduation rate for the Class of 2019, showing a 27.9 percentage point increase in ten years.



FALL 2021

Cleveland Transformation Alliance convenes conversations to update The Cleveland Plan to reflect successes, our continued work, and lessons learned during the pandemic. The CTA Board votes to support the update in September 2021. A month later, the Board also approves its first-ever strategic plan.

WINTER 2023

The Cleveland Transformation Alliance updates the online School Finder Tool and the printed School Quality Guide to make them better tools for families.

The refreshed resources provide more information about the "extras" provided by schools and improves the ability to search for schools aligned to children's interests.



SPRING 2025

CTA wraps up its work and hands off the School Quality Guide and the School Finder tool to continue the important work of empowering families to make informed public school choices.

SAY YES CLEVELAND



In January 2019, Say Yes Cleveland was launched, creating a game-changing opportunity for generations of Clevelanders. For the next 25 years, Say Yes Cleveland will provide two big things for students in CMSD and partnering charter schools: support services in school from PreK through high school graduation, and tuition scholarships after high school.

SUPPORT SERVICES

Say Yes Cleveland provides support services to students from PreK through 12th grade, in 100% of CMSD and partner charter schools.

Services include

- A Family Support Specialist in each school to connect students and their families to needed assistance.
- Free legal assistance.
- Free physical, mental, and behavioral health services.

TUITION SCHOLARSHIPS

Say Yes Cleveland provides scholarships to eligible CMSD and partner charter high school graduates toward the cost of tuition at college or postsecondary programs, after federal and state grants.

Say Yes scholarships can be used

- At all public universities, community colleges in Ohio.
- Any Pell-eligible certificate program in Ohio.
- Over 100 private colleges and universities across the country.



WHY SAY YES?

Cleveland's future belongs to its children. That's why Say Yes Cleveland is working to unite our community behind a program that provides the children in our public schools with the supports they need to overcome barriers throughout their school years. Then, after high school, it creates wider opportunities for them by providing a tuition scholarship toward a college degree or career training certificate.

To be eligible for a scholarship, a student must:

1. Be continuously enrolled in a CMSD or partner charter high school, from ninth grade through graduation.
2. Live within the CMSD boundaries continuously from ninth grade through graduation—including the city of Cleveland, the villages of Bratenahl, Linndale, and Newburgh Heights, and parts of Brook Park and Garfield Heights. See map, page 5. Any high school student who experiences homelessness should connect with their school counselor and Project ACT to ensure scholarship eligibility.

Say Yes Cleveland provides scholarships covering the cost of college or postsecondary tuition, after federal and state grants, to every eligible CMSD high school graduate.

What's Covered?

Say Yes scholarships apply to tuition only. Students may be able to use institutional aid and other non-Say Yes scholarships for non-tuition expenses such as room, board, or books.

The scholarship will address the gap between the total cost of tuition, minus federal and state grants.

AT OHIO PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS & PRIVATE SCHOOLS NATIONWIDE

- Students in families earning \$75,000 or less per year, will have the full tuition difference paid for up to eight semesters.
- Students in families earning over \$75,000 a year will receive up to \$5,000 annually, covering up to eight semesters.

UNDERSTANDING CLEVELAND'S EDUCATIONAL LANDSCAPE: PUBLIC CHARTERS, DISTRICT SCHOOLS, AND THE CLEVELAND PLAN

In Cleveland's diverse educational landscape, public charter schools and district schools play significant roles. The Cleveland Plan for Transforming Schools (referred to as The Cleveland Plan) employs a unique partnership model to delineate the various relationships between the district and charter schools within Cleveland's boundaries. These relationships are categorized as Sponsored, Partnered, and Non-Affiliated. This article aims to enlighten families and community members about the specifics of Cleveland's educational landscape.

OVERVIEW

Public Charter Schools

Public charter schools (also called community schools) are independently managed public schools that operate under a performance contract, or a "charter." These schools are overseen by non-profit governing boards as required by Ohio state law. Charter schools are independent of traditional school districts, tuition-free, and receive state and federal funds. Some schools are managed day-to-day by non-profit or for-profit Operators. Charter schools can have more flexibility in their operations than traditional public schools, allowing them to innovate in their teaching methodologies and learning

environments. Open to all students, charter schools are held accountable for academic results in relation to the state's education standards by their authorizer or sponsor and by the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce.

District Schools

District schools, often referred to as traditional public schools, are part of a local school system governed by a traditional school board. They follow a set curriculum and are subject to rules, regulations, and statutes set by governmental bodies. These schools serve all students within a specific geographic area and are funded by local, state, and federal tax dollars.

CLEVELAND'S EDUCATIONAL LANDSCAPE

In Cleveland, the school system operates under mayoral control, a unique governance structure that places the responsibility of the city's public schools under the mayor's purview. This system, instituted in 1998, allows for a more centralized and strategic approach to educational progress.

Under mayoral control, the Mayor of Cleveland appoints

the school board, which selects the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) to oversee the Cleveland Metropolitan School District (CMSD). It's worth noting that the Mayor must concur with the Board's CEO selection. The CEO assumes responsibility for the district's daily operations, strategic planning, and overall performance.

The Differences

Public charter and district schools differ primarily in governance, public accountability, operational flexibility, unionization status, regulatory oversight, funding, budgetary control, performance metrics, transparency, and sponsor oversight.

Charter schools typically operate under the governance of independent nonprofit boards, affording them greater leeway to innovate. District schools are governed by local school boards. Oversight for district schools is often more direct, with policies and standards enforced uniformly across schools within the district.

District schools receive funding from local, state, and federal sources. The district manages the funds and allocates them to individual schools. In contrast, charter schools also receive public funding but often have more budget management and spending flexibility. As explained, charter schools receive funding from state and federal sources. Only charters that are formally Partnered with or Sponsored by CMSD receive local tax dollars.

District schools are evaluated based on state standardized tests, graduation rates, and other academic indicators, with possible interventions for failing to meet set benchmarks. Charter schools are similarly evaluated based on student performance on standardized tests and other educational outcomes. Still, they must also meet specific goals in their charter contracts, which are subject to non-renewal or termination if they are not met.

District schools must be transparent to the community due to open meetings and public records laws. Charter schools are subject to similar transparency laws and are primarily accountable to their sponsors, who monitor their compliance and performance. The state evaluates and oversees these sponsors to ensure effective monitoring of the schools.

The Cleveland Plan for Transforming Schools

The Cleveland Plan is an initiative to reinvent public education in Cleveland. It seeks to create a quality district and charter school network, forming the Sponsored, Partnered, and Non-Affiliated partnership distinctions.

Under this plan, district and charter schools are encouraged to collaborate, sharing best practices and resources to improve Cleveland's overall quality of

education. This partnership is unique because it breaks down the traditional barriers between charter and district schools, fostering an environment of cooperation and shared goals. Cleveland is home to the only relationship like this in the State of Ohio.

The Partnership between District and Charter Schools in Cleveland

The Sponsored, Partnered, and Non-Affiliated partnership model between district and charter schools in Cleveland is fundamental to the city's educational transformation. Through the sponsorship program, Cleveland Metropolitan School District (CMSD) partners with high-performing charter schools, supporting them in various ways. In turn, these charter schools commit to serving the city's students, ensuring they have access to quality education.

This partnership model has adopted greater collaboration between district and charter schools. It aims to open new avenues for innovation, allow for the sharing of resources, and increase transparency and accountability across the board.

House Bill 525's Role in Cleveland's Education Landscape

House Bill 525, also known as the Cleveland Plan Legislation, is a substantial piece of legislation relevant to this work. Passed by the Ohio state legislature in 2012, HB 525 aims to transform public education in Cleveland and improve the quality of education for all students in the city.

The bill strengthens the partnership between district and charter schools by establishing a new level of accountability and cooperation. For instance, it empowers the Cleveland Metropolitan School District to allocate levy funds to partnering charter schools, promoting collaboration over competition.

Overall, HB 525 is a landmark that underscores the importance of collaboration and high-quality education for all students, regardless of whether they attend a district or charter school.

In conclusion, the educational landscape in Cleveland is evolving, marked by a unique partnership between public charter schools and district schools under the umbrella of the Cleveland Plan. As families and community members, understanding this landscape is fundamental to supporting and participating in the city's ongoing commitment to delivering quality education for all its students.

ENTENDIENDO EL PANORAMA EDUCATIVO DE CLEVELAND: ESCUELAS PÚBLICAS CHÁRTER, ESCUELAS DISTRITALES Y EL PLAN DE CLEVELAND

En el diverso panorama educativo de Cleveland, las escuelas públicas chárter y las escuelas del distrito desempeñan un papel importante. El Plan de Cleveland para la Transformación de las Escuelas (conocido como el Plan de Cleveland) emplea un modelo de asociación único para delinear las diversas relaciones entre el distrito y las escuelas chárter dentro de los límites de Cleveland. Estas relaciones se clasifican como Patrocinadas, Asociadas y No Afiliadas. Este artículo tiene como objetivo ilustrar a las familias y a los miembros de la comunidad sobre los detalles del panorama educativo de Cleveland.

VISIÓN GENERAL

Escuelas públicas chárter

Las escuelas públicas chárter (también conocidas como escuelas comunitarias) son escuelas públicas administradas de manera independiente que operan bajo un contrato de desempeño, o una "chárter". Estas escuelas son supervisadas por juntas directivas sin fines de lucro, según lo exige la ley estatal de Ohio. Las escuelas chárter son independientes de los distritos escolares tradicionales, tienen matrícula gratuita y reciben fondos estatales y federales. Algunas escuelas son administradas día a día por operadores sin fines de lucro o con fines de lucro. Las escuelas chárter pueden tener más flexibilidad en sus operaciones que las escuelas públicas tradicionales, lo que les permite innovar en sus metodologías de enseñanza y entornos de aprendizaje. Abiertas a todos los estudiantes, las escuelas chárter son responsables de los resultados académicos en relación con los estándares

educativos del estado por su autorizador o patrocinador y por el Departamento de Educación y Fuerza Laboral de Ohio.

Escuelas del Distrito

Las escuelas del distrito, a menudo denominadas escuelas públicas tradicionales, son parte de un sistema escolar local gobernado por una junta escolar tradicional. Siguen un plan de estudios establecido y están sujetos a reglas, regulaciones y estatutos establecidos por organismos gubernamentales. Estas escuelas atienden a todos los estudiantes dentro de un área geográfica específica y están financiadas por dinero de los impuestos locales, estatales y federales.

EL PANORAMA EDUCATIVO DE CLEVELAND

En Cleveland, el sistema escolar opera bajo el control de la alcaldía, una estructura de gobierno única que coloca la responsabilidad de las escuelas públicas de la ciudad bajo el ámbito del alcalde. Este sistema, instituido en 1998, permite un enfoque más centralizado y estratégico del progreso educativo.

Bajo el control de la alcaldía, el alcalde de Cleveland nombra a la junta escolar, que selecciona al Director Ejecutivo (CEO) para supervisar el Distrito Escolar Metropolitano de Cleveland (CMSD). Vale la pena señalar que el alcalde debe estar de acuerdo con la selección del director ejecutivo de la Junta. El director ejecutivo asume la responsabilidad de las operaciones diarias, la planificación estratégica y el rendimiento general del distrito.

Las diferencias

Las escuelas públicas chárter y distritales difieren principalmente en la gobernanza, la responsabilidad pública, la flexibilidad operativa, el estado de sindicalización, la supervisión regulatoria, el financiamiento, el control presupuestario, las métricas de rendimiento, la transparencia y la supervisión de los patrocinadores.

Las escuelas chárter suelen operar bajo el gobierno de juntas independientes sin fines de lucro, lo que les da un mayor margen de maniobra para innovar. Las escuelas del distrito son gobernadas por las juntas escolares locales. La supervisión de las escuelas del distrito suele ser más directa, y las políticas y normas se aplican de manera uniforme en todas las escuelas del distrito.

Las escuelas del distrito reciben fondos de fuentes locales, estatales y federales. El distrito administra los fondos y los asigna a las escuelas individuales. En contraste, las escuelas chárter también reciben fondos públicos, pero a menudo tienen más flexibilidad en la gestión del presupuesto y el gasto. Como se explicó, las escuelas chárter reciben fondos de fuentes estatales y federales. Solo las escuelas chárter que están formalmente asociadas o patrocinadas por CMSD reciben dólares de los impuestos locales.

Las escuelas del distrito se evalúan en función de las pruebas estandarizadas del estado, las tasas de graduación y otros indicadores académicos, con posibles intervenciones para no cumplir con los puntos de referencia establecidos. Las escuelas chárter se evalúan de manera similar en función del rendimiento de los estudiantes en las pruebas estandarizadas y otros resultados educativos. Sin embargo, también deben cumplir objetivos específicos en sus contratos de fletamento, que están sujetos a no renovación o rescisión si no se cumplen.

Las escuelas del distrito deben ser transparentes para la comunidad debido a las leyes de reuniones abiertas y registros públicos. Las escuelas chárter están sujetas a leyes de transparencia similares y son principalmente responsables ante sus patrocinadores, quienes supervisan su cumplimiento y desempeño. El estado evalúa y supervisa a estos patrocinadores para garantizar un monitoreo efectivo de las escuelas.

La Asociación entre las Escuelas del Distrito y las Escuelas Chárter en Cleveland

El modelo de asociación patrocinada, asociada y no afiliada entre las escuelas del distrito y las chárter en Cleveland es fundamental para la transformación educativa de la ciudad. A través del programa de patrocinio, el Distrito Escolar Metropolitano de Cleveland (CMSD) se asocia con escuelas chárter de alto rendimiento, apoyándolas de varias maneras. A su vez, estas escuelas chárter se comprometen a servir a los

estudiantes de la ciudad, asegurando que tengan acceso a una educación de calidad.

Este modelo de asociación ha adoptado una mayor colaboración entre el distrito y las escuelas chárter. Su objetivo es abrir nuevas vías para la innovación, permitir el intercambio de recursos y aumentar la transparencia y la rendición de cuentas en todos los ámbitos.

El papel de la Alianza para la Transformación de Cleveland

La Alianza para la Transformación de Cleveland (CTA, por sus siglas en inglés) es importante en el modelo educativo de Cleveland. Como una asociación público-privada dedicada a desarrollar una cultura de escuelas distritales y chárter de alta calidad, CTA trabaja para garantizar que todos los estudiantes de Cleveland tengan acceso a una educación pública equitativa y de alta calidad. CTA apoya el modelo; Cada vecindario tiene escuelas de alta calidad entre las que las familias pueden elegir. CTA lleva a cabo su misión evaluando la calidad de todas las escuelas públicas de Cleveland, informando a la comunidad sobre el progreso de el portafolio de escuelas de Cleveland y asegurando la fidelidad al plan educativo de toda la ciudad.

El papel del proyecto de ley 525 de la Cámara de Representantes en el panorama educativo de Cleveland

El Proyecto de Ley 525 de la Cámara de Representantes, también conocido como la Legislación del Plan de Cleveland, es una legislación sustancial relevante para este trabajo. Aprobada por la legislatura del estado de Ohio en 2012, la HB 525 tiene como objetivo transformar la educación pública en Cleveland y mejorar la calidad de la educación para todos los estudiantes de la ciudad.

El proyecto de ley fortalece la asociación entre las escuelas del distrito y las chárter al establecer un nuevo nivel de responsabilidad y cooperación. Por ejemplo, faculta al Distrito Escolar Metropolitano de Cleveland para asignar fondos de gravamen a las escuelas chárter asociadas, promoviendo la colaboración sobre la competencia.

En general, la HB 525 es un hito que subraya la importancia de la colaboración y la educación de alta calidad para todos los estudiantes, independientemente de si asisten a una escuela del distrito o a una escuela chárter.

En conclusión, el panorama educativo en Cleveland está evolucionando, marcado por una asociación única entre las escuelas públicas chárter y las escuelas del distrito bajo el paraguas del Plan de Cleveland. Como familias y miembros de la comunidad, comprender este panorama es fundamental para apoyar y participar en el compromiso continuo de la ciudad de brindar una educación de calidad para todos sus estudiantes.

The field of education is complex and multifaceted, with many factors contributing to the functioning and success of schools. Readers are encouraged to explore these topics to gain a more comprehensive understanding.

GLOSSARY

Sponsored: Refers to entities approved to sponsor community schools (Public Charter). These sponsors are responsible for overseeing the schools to ensure they meet state educational and operational standards. They must comply with all applicable laws and regulations, and their performance is subject to evaluation by the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce. Sponsors can continue their sponsorship based on the terms of existing contracts and may enter new contracts under certain conditions, such as maintaining an adequate rating.

In Reference to The Cleveland Plan A sponsored school has a signed sponsorship contract with the Cleveland Metropolitan School District (CMSD). This sponsorship implies that the Charter school receives specific funds and that its State Report Card results are included in the district's overall report card. A sponsor, also known as an authorizer, has the authority to establish a community school, ensuring that the schools adhere to their contracts and meet all legally mandated fiscal, academic, and operational requirements. Sponsors make important decisions, such as whether to renew contracts with community schools and provide oversight and technical assistance.

Partnered: Generally, it implies a formal collaborative agreement between entities (e.g., a community school/Public Charter and a sponsoring body) to achieve shared educational goals. The specifics of such partnerships can vary, but they typically involve shared responsibilities and resources to enhance academic outcomes.

In Reference to The Cleveland Plan A partnered school has a signed partnership agreement with CMSD. This agreement includes collaborating with the district and endorsing each other's programs. All Sponsored schools are also considered Partner schools, and they participate in initiatives like the Cleveland Education Compact, which fosters collaboration and shares practices to improve education standards across schools. Please note that CMSD does not sponsor all Partnered charter schools.

Operator: Typically, the management organization or individual responsible for the daily administration and management of the school. This includes ensuring compliance with the curriculum and educational standards set forth by the state and the sponsor.

Non-Affiliated: Refers to entities or individuals that are not formally connected with or regulated by Cleveland Metropolitan School District (CMSD). They do not participate in sponsorship and are not subject to the same oversight or evaluation as CMSD-sponsored or Partner schools.

Authorizer: Synonymous with sponsor, an authorizer is an entity that has the authority to create, oversee, and close community schools based on compliance with contractual obligations and performance standards. Authorizers are evaluated and must maintain a minimum performance rating to continue their roles.

Curriculum: A structured set of academic standards and educational content designed to ensure that students across various grade levels receive a coherent, focused, and rigorous education. It specifies the essential knowledge and skills that students are expected to acquire. Curriculum in public schools is typically closely aligned with state-mandated academic standards.

State Education Standards: These are benchmarks set by the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce that define what students should know and be able to do at each grade level. Sponsors are responsible for ensuring that the community schools they oversee meet these standards.

1. PREPARE FOR COLLEGE & CAREER

At College Now, advisors are uniquely trained to match individuals of all ages and levels of experience with the educational pathways to wealth-creating occupations. This is not a “one size fits all” approach. For some the educational pathway might be a four-year degree in accounting; for others, a two-year nursing degree; and still for others, an 18-month welding apprenticeship.

CMSD provides transportation for students who live one or more miles from school, and provides free RTA passes for older students.



CALL THE TRANSPORTATION HOTLINE

216-838-4287 (or 216-838-4BUS) to understand your options. Hotline staff are available weekdays through the school year and in the summer.

Busing for all CMSD students and most Cleveland charter school students is coordinated by the CMSD Transportation Department. Their professional staff work closely with school choice and enrollment to offer complete information to families about their options for schools and busing.

TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

GETTING TO NEIGHBORHOOD ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS—DISTRICT AND CHARTER

Preschool students are eligible for transportation only if they have a disability. Transportation eligibility is based on distance from the home residence to the school.

Students in grades K-8 must live 1.00 miles or more from their home school to receive some form of transportation service. To receive a yellow school bus, students must live within a 1.00-mile—3.00-mile radius, except for CMSD city-wide draw schools.

Students in grades 9-12 must live 1.00 miles or more from their home school to receive RTA transportation. (Identification swipe cards are provided for this group.) The State of Ohio only requires transportation for students in grades K-8 who reside more than 2.0 miles from school. Ohio does not require transportation for grades 9-12.



GETTING TO HIGH SCHOOL

CMSD partners closely with RTA to deliver students safe and sound to school on time every day through their buses, trains, and stations.

Students in grades 9-12 receive combination school ID cards that include an RTA swipe pass to allow them to travel from 6 am - 8 pm weekdays.

Special situations:

Students with disabilities of all ages are provided with transportation if it's included in their Individualized Education Program (IEP).

Did you choose an elementary school outside your neighborhood?

Transportation is not guaranteed for students in schools other than their closest neighborhood school, but staff can work with you to identify available routes. Students at schools with unique models, and the single-gender elementary schools may be eligible for yellow bus access. You can call the hotline at 216-838-4BUS all year-round, including through the summer to explore your options.

Do you live outside of Cleveland?

There are some addresses outside the city of Cleveland that fall within the footprint of the CMSD and are eligible for transportation. If you live outside of CMSD's service area, you must make your own transportation arrangements.

If you're staying somewhere temporarily:

You may access transportation services by bus, cab, or van through Project ACT.

NAVIGATING CHALLENGES

DID YOU KNOW?

Homelessness goes by many names—staying with family, doubling up, in transition—and deeply affects students' ability to learn. More than six percent of children in Cleveland experience homelessness in a given year.



SUPPORTING YOUTH AND FAMILIES IN TRANSITION

Project ACT provides instructional and support services to students in preschool through grade 12 who are in temporary living situations.

They offer a holistic and comprehensive approach to ensure students have access to education and can fully participate in school, including:

- Removing barriers that would limit a student's ability to fully engage and participate in school activities and events.
- Partnering with families to identify and meet student's physical, social, and emotional needs.
- Empowering parents to support their children.

You can register your child with Project ACT at the district office, 1111 Superior Ave; the corner of 12th and Superior. They are open Monday through Friday, 8 am -4 pm to register your child. Call 216-838-0210 for more information on how you can help students navigate these transitions.

STUDENTS IN TEMPORARY LIVING SITUATIONS

Students in temporary living situations face significant barriers to educational success and benefit from the stability that a secure school placement can provide. The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act is a federal law that grants important educational rights to students in temporary living situations.

A student is protected under McKinney-Vento if they lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence. This includes children and youth who are:

- Staying in a shelter, including emergency/transitional shelters, domestic violence shelters, and runaway and homeless youth shelters.
- Doubled-up with a friend, relative or someone else because their family lost their home due to eviction, foreclosure, natural disaster, or economic reasons; or staying in a motel, hotel, trailer park, or campground because they have nowhere else to go.
- Staying in housing that is substandard or lacks full utilities.
- Living in places not ordinarily used for sleeping, including cars, parks, public places, abandoned buildings, or bus or train stations.
- Abandoned in a hospital.
- Unaccompanied youth, not living at home. This includes children and youth who:
 - Were asked to leave home or locked out by a parent/legal guardian,
 - Left home without consent of parents (runaways), or
 - Are living doubled-up without a legal guardian due to economic reasons or lack formal custody papers while their parents may be incarcerated, hospitalized, or in a rehabilitation center.

Know Your Rights

- Students in temporary housing have a right under the McKinney-Vento Act to:
 - Receive a free, appropriate public education.
 - Enroll in school immediately, even if lacking documents normally required for enrollment, or having missed application or enrollment deadlines during any period of homelessness.
 - Attend classes while the school gathers needed documents.
 - Continue attending the school of origin, or enroll in a different school where space is available, at the request of the parent, guardian, or Receive transportation to and from school.
 - Receive educational services comparable to those provided to students in permanent housing.
- The right to a written explanation if your child is assigned to a school other than the school of your choice, and the right to appeal that decision.

WHEN, HOW (AND IF) TO CHANGE SCHOOLS

It's always tough to be the new kid in the middle of the school year: to find new friends, adapt to new teachers and rules. But for more than 6.5 million students nationwide, being the new kid can be a frequent occurrence—and there is a cost to their social and academic development.

What Is Student Mobility?

In K-12 education, "student mobility," also called "churn" or "transience," can include any time a student changes schools for reasons other than grade promotion, but in general it refers to students changing schools during a school year.

It may be voluntary—such as a student changing schools to participate in a new program—or involuntary, such as being expelled or escaping from bullying. Student mobility is often related to residential mobility, such as when a family becomes homeless or moves due to changes in a parent's job.

The Summer Switch

Voluntary transfers, which are more likely to happen during the summer, cause less academic disruption and may be associated with academic improvement if they lead to better services for the student.

Changing Schools because of Conflict

You are an expert on your child and their needs. Before moving them to another school, which could impact their achievement long term, try working through the conflict as your child's advocate. No one knows your child better than you; the school should welcome your presence and efforts to improve their experience and achievement at school. For tips, see page 194.

HOW DOES MOBILITY AFFECT STUDENT LEARNING?



Even normal transitions—at the start of school, sixth and ninth grades for example—can cause some students to stumble. Prior research has found students who attended K-8 schools have slightly higher academic achievement than those who attended 6-8 middle schools, and students are at higher risk of dropping out or having behavior issues during transition years like ninth grade.

Various studies have found student mobility—and particularly multiple moves—is associated with a lower school engagement, poorer grades, and a higher risk of dropping out of high school. Research has found students **generally lose about three months of reading and math learning** each time they switch schools.

CHOOSING AND STICKING TO YOUR CHOICE IN THE EARLY YEARS



Mobility can be particularly hard on children in the early grades, as they learn foundational skills and build trust with peers and educators. A 2015 study found that the more often early elementary students moved, the lower they scored on both the state standardized math test, and on teacher observations of the students' critical thinking.

NAVIGATING CHALLENGES

WHEN CONFLICTS ARISE

Conflict is a normal part of life. When conflicts arise at school, there are things you can do to improve the situation and open up communication.

1.



Stay positive. Your words are the most powerful to your child and will shape their expectations. Even if you're feeling negative toward an adult at the school, try not to let your child know that.

2.



Listen carefully. In order to get the facts straight, ask your child open-ended questions, then follow up by asking for specific examples that tell you what you're dealing with. Make notes about the issue with dates to help you notice patterns. Does your student just need to vent? Sharing with you may help put their feelings into words.

3.



Brainstorm solutions together. Your child may have some ideas about what they, the teacher, or you can do to fix the problem. Soliciting your child's input will show them their thoughts are valued, and forging a plan together may help them be more receptive to possible solutions.

4.



Observe the situation. Get as much information as you can about the source of the conflict before scheduling a meeting with staff. Question other parents whose children are or were in the same situation for their input.

5.



Open a dialogue. Ask, "How do you feel my child is doing?" Listen to the staff member's assessment and suggestions before you express your concerns. Posing questions and avoiding accusations will yield the best results. Bring along a notepad with your notes, and to keep track of what responses you receive.

6.



Build the connection. Volunteering time or keeping in regular contact with a teacher by phone, text, or email will help you understand each other and communicate better. When a teacher does make an extra effort with your child, reach out to show your appreciation.

7.



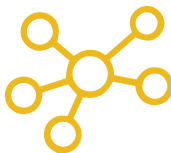
If necessary, meet with the next person up the chain of command. If you feel the situation isn't improving and you aren't getting an adequate response from the teacher, request a meeting with a school leader. The principal may be able to explain the teacher's approach and more objectively assess the situation. You can find out from the school's website who the principal reports to.

8.



Give it some time. Some changes take time to show up in a child's achievement, but monitor your child to see if things are improving, staying the same, or getting worse.

9.



Explore your options. Would a different teacher or classroom make a difference? Have you taken the issue to the top of this school and found no relief? Studies have shown that children who switch schools lose out on learning, so try to hold out until the end of the year.

BELIEVING IN CLEVELAND: A TEACHER'S COMMITMENT TO HIS COMMUNITY

Christopher Rodriguez, a first-year math teacher at John Marshall High School in Cleveland, is a shining example of the impact of Say Yes Cleveland. Rodriguez, who grew up in the Cleveland Metropolitan School District (CMSD), never thought college was an option because of its financial burden. However, when Say Yes Cleveland came to his high school offering free tuition to all CMSD graduates, his dreams of going to college became a reality.

Say Yes Cleveland is a partnership with CMSD that aims to strengthen the city's economy, neighborhoods, and workforce by providing CMSD high school graduates with tuition scholarships for college or career training. The organization also provides family support services to help younger students succeed in school. By eliminating the financial barrier of tuition, Say Yes Cleveland empowers CMSD graduates to pursue their educational and career goals without the crushing burden of student debt.

"A lot of students go thousands of dollars in debt, and they can probably never get out of that. With a Say Yes Cleveland scholarship actually paying for my tuition, I could go to college and not have that stress or worry," said Rodriguez. The scholarship gave him the opportunity to study at Kent State University, where he earned a degree in education. Now, he's back in his hometown, teaching at John Marshall High School—the very school he once attended.

Rodriguez's story is not just about overcoming financial obstacles. It's about the power of mentorship, the importance of community, and the fulfillment of giving back. Through the College Now mentoring program, he was paired with Greg Atkins, a network leader in CMSD who provided career guidance and support. Inspired by these experiences and a desire to be a role model, Rodriguez chose to return to Cleveland to teach.

"Cleveland has always been home," he explains. "It's always been a comfort place for me, and I want to be a role model for those students who are not able to afford college. I want to do nothing but provide them

support and continue this momentum of Cleveland's transformation. At CMSD, we believe in Cleveland. We believe in the mission of helping our students continue to grow, to be people like me, who have college degrees."

As a young teacher, Rodriguez connects with his students and understands their experiences. He enjoys sharing his story with students and inspiring them to pursue their own dreams. He also strives to make geometry relatable and engaging, helping students overcome their struggles with the subject. "I love teaching geometry" he says. "I find purpose and passion in it. I find good fulfillment in teaching my students geometry and applying that to real life."

Reflecting on his journey, Rodriguez offers this advice to current Say Yes Cleveland scholars: "Take all the opportunities that you can. They provide you with so many opportunities. They connect you to so many people." He credits Say Yes Cleveland with continuing to motivate him and push him further.

Rodriguez's journey is a testament to the transformative power of education and the impact of Say Yes Cleveland. His story is an inspiration to students, educators, and anyone who believes in the power of community and the importance of giving back.

KEEPING YOUR CHILD SAFE AT SCHOOL: WHAT FAMILIES NEED TO KNOW

At Cleveland Metropolitan School District (CMSD), we understand that the safety and well-being of your children is your top priority. CMSD is deeply committed to fostering a safe and supportive culture where every scholar and adult feels a sense of physical and emotional safety.

Through our Department of Safety and Security, we partner with students, employees, and the broader community to cultivate a safe and orderly environment where students can learn and thrive. This department oversees the emergency management and safety program, ensures compliance with all applicable laws, conducts drills, and maintains a secure environment. Additionally, the department is actively involved in crisis management and coordinates with local authorities to ensure safety during incidents.

CMSD prioritizes safety with regular drills

The district conducts regular safety drills to prepare students and staff for a variety of potential incidents.

- **Active shooter drills:** These drills, also known as code drills, are conducted across 90 CMSD schools during the first month of the school year.
- **Fire drills:** These drills are held within the first 10 days of school, and then on a monthly basis throughout the academic year.
- **Tornado drills:** These drills are practiced monthly during the peak tornado season, from April to July.

These drills are designed to familiarize students and staff with emergency procedures, ensuring a swift and effective response in the event of an actual crisis. How CMSD is working to create a bully-free environment

Bullying can be another serious concern for parents. Bullying is the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person (or group) by another person (or group), where the relationship involves an imbalance of power.

Bullying behavior can be:

- Physical—punching, hitting, shoving, etc.
- Verbal—name-calling, teasing, sarcasm, threats, belittling
- Social—spreading rumors, leaving someone out on purpose, breaking up friendships
- Emotional—isolating others, tormenting, threatening

gestures, ridicule, humiliation, intimidating, excluding, manipulation and coercion

- Online—posting harmful messages on social media, sharing photos, sending nasty text messages, social exclusion

At CMSD, we are committed to creating a safe and supportive environment where every student feels respected and valued. If you suspect your child is being bullied, please contact your child's teacher, school counselor, principal, or assistant principal immediately. Students are also encouraged to notify school personnel if they ever feel they are a victim of a bully or bully-like behavior. If they are not comfortable speaking directly to a trusted adult, they can also call our Safety and Security Hotline at 216-838-SAFE (7233) and leave an Anonymous Alert.

To equip principals and school staff with the tools to proactively support students, the district's Humanware Department has established an Anti-Bullying Multi-Tiered System of Support Framework. This framework helps students by helping to minimize the risk of bullying and fostering resilience if they are faced with a bullying situation.

This framework is made up of three tiers:

- **Tier one:** Teaching and modeling social-emotional learning (SEL) competencies, holding morning meetings to reinforce positive behavior expectations and response to bullying, conducting monthly anti-bullying enrichment activities, and SEL coordinator-facilitated activities and supports
- **Tier two:** Identifying students being bullied or those initiating bully-like behavior, using mediation or restorative conferencing for those involved, and providing assertiveness training and support groups
- **Tier three:** Implementing student support team accommodations (for the victim or perpetrator) and behavioral specialist support (for the perpetrator)

Our comprehensive approach to bullying prevention and open communication with students and families reflect our dedication to providing a safe and prepared learning environment for all students.

Our commitment to school safety and security

CMSD takes a multifaceted approach to ensure that the physical school buildings are safe and conducive to learning.

- **Secure access control:** Measures are in place to control

access to school buildings, limiting entry only to authorized individuals.

- **Regular maintenance inspections:** Facilities are regularly inspected to identify and address potential hazards.
- **Emergency management plans:** The district maintains up-to-date emergency management plans.
- **Collaboration with local authorities:** CMSD works closely with police, fire departments, and other local authorities to maintain a safe environment and coordinate responses to emergencies. In addition, CMSD's Department of Safety and Security partners with city outreach violence interrupters who support hotspot areas during morning arrivals and dismissals.
- **Emergency procedures:** Emergency procedures are clearly posted in accessible areas, and regular drills are conducted to ensure students and staff are familiar with these procedures.

To report a concern, students, families, or community members can contact our dispatch center, which is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. Or, call our Safety and Security Hotline at 216-838-SAFE (7233).

Going to and from school: What you can do to ensure your children are safe

- **Drop-off and pick-up zones:** Always use the designated drop-off and pick-up areas. These zones are strategically located to minimize traffic congestion and ensure the safety of students.
- **Supervised arrival and departure:** School staff are present during arrival and dismissal times to monitor student safety. Please adhere to the staff's directions during these times.
- **Timeliness:** Ensure your child arrives at school on time and is picked up promptly after school to reduce the likelihood of unsupervised or unsafe situations.
- **Identification and security checks:** If you are picking up your child, ensure that your identification matches what is on file with the school. This helps us maintain strict security protocols for student release.
- **Emergency contacts:** Keep your emergency contact information updated with the school to facilitate smooth communication in case of unexpected changes or emergencies.
- **Bus procedures:** For students using school buses, ensure they understand the importance of following bus safety rules. CMSD collaborates with bus drivers and transportation staff to guarantee a secure environment during transit.

If you have concerns or specific questions about your child's arrival and departure procedures, please reach out to your school's building administrator. Together, we can ensure every student's safety and provide a secure and prepared learning environment for all students.

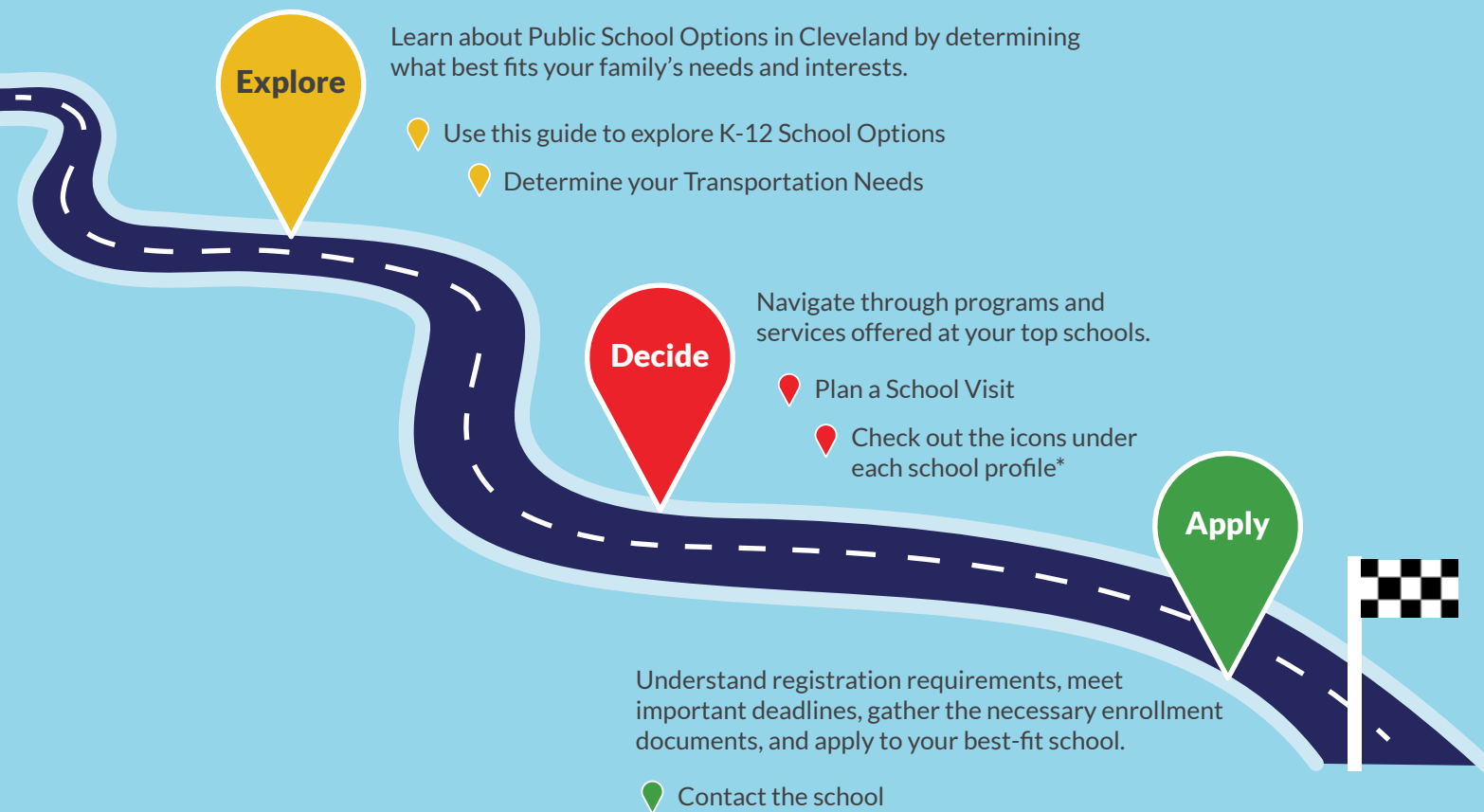

SCHOOL CHOICE OPTIONS: The School Choice Options report provides readers with an understanding of the number of students who are partaking in enrollment options other than their own district of residence. The data does not reflect the quantity or quality of options within each category.

DROPOUT PREVENTION AND CREDIT RECOVERY (DOP): can help students aged 16-21 earn high school credits and prepare students to move on to a certification program, apprenticeship, or two-year degree program. Enrolling students must be at least one grade level behind their age group or have experiences that prevent them from continuing at a traditional high school.

Report Card Guide



UNDERSTANDING THE 2024 RATING SYSTEM

The 2024 State report card rating system used to evaluate district and school performance in Ohio highlights the introduction of an overall rating from 1 to 5 stars in half-star increments based on **five** components. This rating system aims to provide an accessible overview of educational performance, highlighting areas of success and those needing improvement.

Each key component evaluates different aspects of school performance:

Achievement Component evaluates how well students perform against state educational standards, primarily through their scores on state assessments. It looks at the overall mastery of the curriculum, indicating students' level of understanding in key subject areas.

Progress Component measures students' academic growth over time, regardless of their starting point. It assesses how much students have improved in their learning from one year to the next, focusing on the progress students make rather than just their final achievement levels.

Gap Closing Component evaluates how well schools are addressing the educational needs of all students, particularly focusing on reducing achievement gaps between different groups of students, ensuring equity in education and that all students have equal opportunities to succeed academically.

This involves analyzing achievement and progress disparities across different demographic groups, such as racial and ethnic groups, economically disadvantaged students, students with disabilities, and English language learners, to identify and address educational inequities.

Early Literacy Component assesses younger students' reading and writing skills, focusing on their proficiency in foundational literacy. It aims to ensure students are on track with their literacy development at an early age, which is crucial for their overall academic success.

Graduation Component assesses the percentage of students who successfully complete high school within four or five years. It reflects the effectiveness of a school's educational program in keeping students engaged and on track to graduate, highlighting the school's ability to prepare students for post-secondary success.

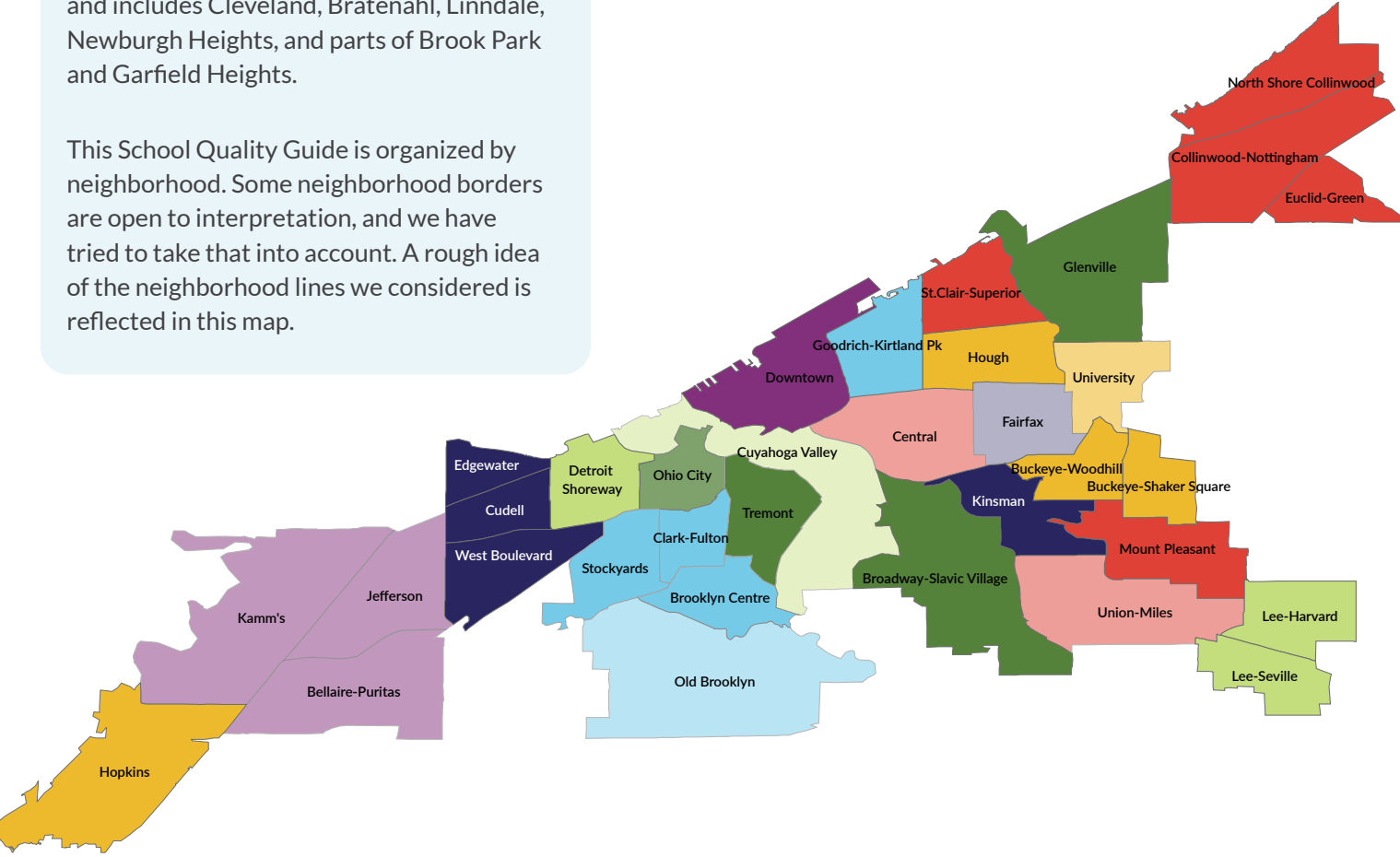
College, Career, Workforce, and Military Readiness Component in the report card guide is designed to evaluate how well schools prepare students for various post-graduation paths, including military service. For the 2024 report cards, this component is for informational purposes only and does not contribute to the overall rating of schools and districts. It aims to provide insights into students' readiness for life after high school in diverse areas, including military careers.

The Dropout Prevention and Recovery Report Cards evaluate schools based on their success in retaining students and facilitating their completion of high school. These report cards specifically measure the effectiveness of programs designed to prevent students from dropping out and support students in recovering and completing their education if they have previously left school.

The Cleveland Metropolitan School District is the second largest school district in the State of Ohio. The district is 82 square miles and includes Cleveland, Bratenahl, Linndale, Newburgh Heights, and parts of Brook Park and Garfield Heights.

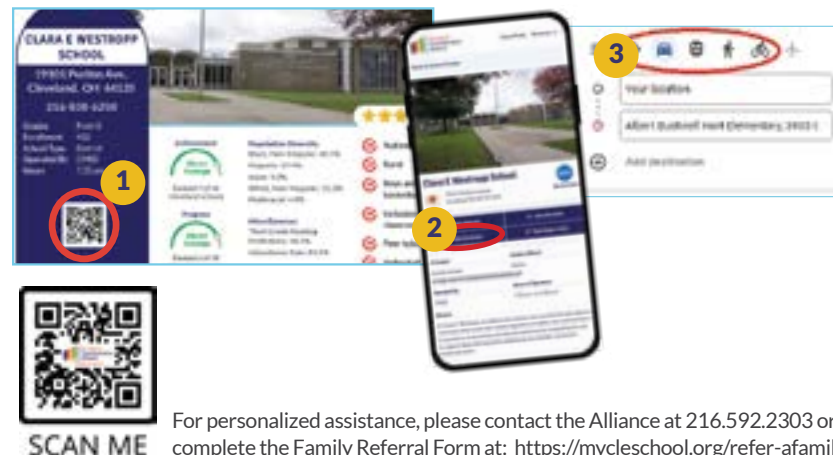
